

The information you have provided on this form will be held by Hook Norton Tennis Club ("the club") for the purpose of maintaining membership and facilitating the organisation of the club.

Hook Norton Tennis Club Rules:

Hook Norton Tennis Club is a member of the Hook Norton Sports and Social Club and pays ground rent to that organisation for its space within the playing fields complex. The maintenance, upkeep and development of tennis facilities within HNSSC remain the responsibility of HNTC. Each tennis club member is automatically a member of the Sports and Social Club by payment of an additional fee included in the tennis club subscription, except in certain circumstances. This brings entitlement to the use of all the Hook Norton Sports and Social Club facilities, except in certain circumstances.

Membership of the club shall be open to all those who pay the appropriate annual subscription as determined by the Management Committee.

There shall be an Annual General Meeting each year which all Full Members are entitled to attend and vote at.

A full copy of the Club Constitution is available from the Secretary on request.

The Committee reserves the right to refuse use of the courts if they or any equipment is abused or in accordance with the Constitution.

Only junior members who have, at the decision of the Committee, reached a sufficiently high standard will be permitted to play at senior club sessions.

Tennis shoes must always be worn on courts, (not hard soled trainers which will damage the court surface).

The nets must always be lowered after play.

During club sessions singles shall not be played when there are enough players present to play doubles.

No group of players shall occupy a court for more than one short set if other players are waiting to play at club sessions.

Lights must be extinguished by 10.00pm prompt each evening.

Chewing gum and smoking is banned on or near the courts.

If the courts are frozen, play will be suspended, until clear of frost. Considerable damage can result to the court surface with breakdown of the carpet fibres.

The courts are used entirely at your own risk and the club can accept no responsibility for any personal injury, loss or damage to you or your property.
